# 1<sup>st</sup> International Youth Forum of the Coubertin Schools in Le Havre (France)

On the occasion of the Congress of the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee – "Coubertin and Olympism: Questions for the Future" – in Le Havre, a Youth Forum was organised for the first time. Pupils from six Coubertin Schools from four different countries competed against each other for the *Coubertin Badge* and presented the results of their work during the closing ceremony of the congress. From then on, the establishment of an International Network of Coubertin Schools began. Consequently, our school is one of the founding members and has henceforth committed itself to an Olympic education.


### The two-year EU-Socrates Project "In the footsteps of William Penny Brookes and Pierre de Coubertin"

A shared Olympic idea between our Coubertin-Gymnasium and the William Brookes School, saw the town of Much Wenlock in Shropshire, England become the starting point for an extensive project focusing on the friendship between Dr. William Penny Brookes and Pierre de Coubertin.

Alongside studies made at original sites (such as the archives in Brookes' birthplace and exhibitions in the Much Wenlock Museum), the 20 participants got to know more about the homeland of William Penny Brookes in the county of Shropshire – the cradle of the Industrial Revolution.

The highlight was the involvement of our athletes as the first foreign participants in the 113<sup>th</sup> Wenlock Olympic Games (the first Games were held in 1850 under the guidance of Dr. William Penny Brookes). Our project results were documented both in English and German in an 80-page brochure as well as on 10 posters.



# Interdisciplinary project on Olympic education:

The creation process of the pupils' exhibition "Pierre de Coubertin - Life and Work of a Humanist"

50 pupils from form 11Sp devoted themselves to this project, which involved the subjects English, French, history, art, computer sciences, and sports theory.

Alongside the exhibition for the school building, a touring exhibition done in German, English, and French, was also elaborated and has been shown on all continents. It was displayed at the Athens 2004, Turin 2006, Beijing 2008, London 2012 and Rio 2016 Olympic Games'. In the meantime, our partner schools translated our text into 16 other languages. Our exhibition is now available in 19 languages.

# A Multidisciplinary Project on Olympic Education:

The Development of an Honorary Gallery of Olympic Medallists for our School Building

In a school project (made up of the subjects: French, English, and Computer Science), pupils of the form 11Sp created six display boards in celebration of the 20 former students who have won Olympic gold medals over the past five decades.


### Comenius School Development Project "Coubertin Academy"

#### The Idea of the Coubertin Puzzle




# Crossing our fingers for the Olympic athletes in PyeongChang

### The Coubertin Pupils' Prize

Since 2004, the Thuringian state sport federation (Landessportbund), upon the initiative of the German Pierre de Coubertin Committee and in cooperation with the Thuringian Ministry of Education, confers the Coubertin Pupils' Prize.

This award honours deserving young athletes, who, alongside excellent athletic performance, show social engagement and serve as role models for the school community.

Starting with the first prize ceremony, the pupils actively participate in the arrangement of the event at the state sport school in Bad Blankenburg.

By supervising our exhibition on the life and work of our namesake and acting as spokespersons, the pupils play an important role in making Coubertin and his Olympic idea public.
