Who can be considered as a homeless person?


- 1. Homeless people (sleeping in cars, under bridges, stations,...)
- 2. Homeless people (without stable house, charity houses)
- 3. People in insecure housing (squatting)
- 4. People in inadequate housing (they own houses, BUT ruined houses, with no electricity, water, sanitation,...)



HOMELESSNESS CONSEQUENCES:

- Discrimination
- 1000's of deaths that we can avoid every year
- The "hardest" form of homelessness includes surviving on the streets without a roof.





- l. Excessive drug and alcohol use.
- 2. Unwillingness to work systematically.
- 3. Combination of behavioural disorders and unwillingness to work.
- 4. Mental disorder.
- 5. Physical disability.
- 6. Tragedy and problems in the family.
- 7. Loss of housing due to other circumstances.
- 8. Migration for work to big cities or other countries.

FACTORS THAT HELP TO INCREASE HOMELESSNESS

- high housing prices or inaccessible cheap housing,
- high unemployment and
- inadequate care for those in need


But society can fix that!



FROM THE POINT OF VIEW OF TIME

- Short-term homelessness - Long-term homelessness





After World War II, Slovakia fell under the sphere of influence of the Soviet Union and from 1945 to 1989 (the Cold War) Slovakia was under a communist regime.

At that time the word homeless was practically non-existent. After 1989, the market economy generated the phenomenon of homelessness.

Homeless people are mainly taken care of by various charitable org., projects that help these people (The well-known magazine Nota Bene).

RED CROSS RESEARCH IN ZILINA 2020

In 2020, the Red Cross did a research in our city about the homeless.

Can you guess....

What is the longest time a homeless man has spent on the street in our city?

20 years (48 year old man)

How many homeless people have got a regular monthly income?


56 %

And how many % of respondents reported that they still have a close family?

92% (Close family includes spouse, parents, children, etc.)



RESULTS FROM 2020 - ANSWER THE QUESTION WHEN YOU LAST VISITED A GENERAL PRACTIONER:



Only 28% of respondents said they had seen a doctor (specialist, general practitioner) in that year.

12% of respondents said they could not remember when they had been to a doctor.

32% reported mobility problems.

28% reported having blood pressure problems.
